Visible streaks of water can form on the vehicle wall, and at low temperatures, ice can build up as well. Truma's condensate spout offers an original accessory that effectively channels away condensate, helping to keep your vehicle looking its best.

Provides reliable protection for the vehicle wall

During heating mode, warm exhaust gases cause condensate to form on the wall cowl. The new Truma condensate spout specifically collects this water and directs it away from the vehicle wall.



This reduces visible water run-off down the vehicle's walls and helps to maintain the vehicle's appearance, even when using the heating regularly.

Designed for maximum safety

For many campers, it is not just the heating system's functionality but also its safety that matters. The original Truma condensate spout has been specially developed and tested for the next-generation Truma Combi D (E) and the Truma Combi (E). Air and exhaust gas discharge remain unchanged, ensuring the heater functions properly at all times. This also ensures that the heater and the vehicle remain in compliance with the operating permit. Unlike many DIY builds or bespoke retrofit solutions, the original accessories are precisely tailored to the compatible heating systems and have been tested accordingly.

Winter-proof and durable

The condensate spout impresses not only with its functionality but also with its robust execution. The hard-wearing surface reliably withstands the effects of weather and use in everyday camping life. From summer trips to winter camping: these accessories are designed for year-round use.

Installed in seconds

Mounting is straightforward and requires no tools whatsoever. The condensate spout simply clips onto the wall cowl. Integrated retaining clips ensure a secure fit. The condensate spout should be removed before driving off. The tool-free fastening ensures this as quick as the mounting itself.

"Many campers are familiar with water streaks on their vehicle's walls or ice build-up on the cowl, particularly during long periods of heating. That's why we developed the condensate spout (often referred to as a drip lip) as a simple solution that tackles precisely this everyday issue whilst offering the quality and safety of a tried-and-tested Truma original accessory."
